EXHORTATION: A View of The Truth

Part One: Is the Truth A Fact or A Person?

Today, the world is in tumult in all the dimensions of human existence. In the physical realm, there is an increase in the frequency of natural disasters like the Asian-African tidal waves, Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, mudslides, earthquakes, and so much more. The politically cauldron boils with global terrorism and the war to stem the attacks against innocent people. There are tensions between the West and the East over the development of nuclear weapons, and the danger of their being used by religious fanatics. Economically, these natural disasters have led to colossal losses of properties, sources of livelihood, aggravated the pre-existent high cost of living, and increased the incidence of hunger and food insufficiency. Socially, the divorce rates have skyrocketed, the family systems have broken down, and the population of addicts has increased. What is becoming clear is that these problems have overwhelmed us, and that our efforts to solve or even control them are failing. The result of this realization is the desperate search for a higher power, superman, or philosophy that can help us solve these numerous problems, and this is indicated by the emergence of numerous different religious and spiritual beliefs. Some people are searching for a great man with unearthly wisdom and power, some think the answer lies in making a lot of money, others say that Jesus Christ is the answer, while believers in other faiths protest vehemently and present their beliefs as better alternatives. Is the way out embracing eastern religions through the practice of yoga or Tai chi? Can we train the human spirit through stretch exercises to rise out of bondage, and somehow tap into the resources of nature to solve the problems we face? What are the origins of these problems anyway, and what or better yet, who can solve them? Somewhere in this supermarket of ideologies, views, and beliefs lies the truth or the Truth. To identify the truth, we first have to determine if the truth is just a statement of fact or a living force.

The central truth about the life we live should have a commanding knowledge of the sources and contents of the problems of humanity. He or it should know the solutions in all its dimensions and how to apply them to solve problems. If the truth is just a statement of facts, for example, a statement that earth is spherical in shape, or that a person has pathologically-proven diagnosis of cancer, so what then? These are impotent facts that describe the problems but have no solutions. Prayer Topics

- 5. Pray that God would arise and heal our nation, and anoint His sons and daughters with the power of the Holy Spirit to provide answers to the perplexing problems of our days as it was in the days of Daniel and Joseph.
